#### Spelling Frame – Parents guide

We have a new spelling programme in school to encourage the children to practise their spellings whilst having some fun by playing various games. Your child should login using their username and password. For children in Year 1 and 2, their log in details have been glued into the front of their reading diary. The class teacher has a copy of this, so please get in touch if your child misplaces / has forgotten their details.

The Spelling Tiles section offers a range of activities:

- Segment Puzzle matching up the syllable sections
- Sorting Segments looking at the syllables and sorting into correct and incorrect spellings
- Segment Silhouette using the shapes of each letter within the syllables to aid spelling
- Wordsearch finding the spelling word within a grid
- Type it spelling the word

To keep it varied, please encourage your child to do some of these activities each time they log on, as well as playing a game.

Any tests will appear first on the main page. Encourage your child to do the Practice and Test sessions. It is important that the sound is always clicked on so that the sentences are read to your child. This should be done no matter how competent a reader your child is.

Our Scuba Explorer classes a great way for young students between the age of 8-15 years old to discover and advance in scuba diving, whether it be for a holiday, hobby or just a way to socialise, the skills they will learn will benefit all. Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.


