As part of our English lessons in KS2 this week, the children have been researching about the Awa tribe. These are indigenous people living in the Amazon rainforest. The children have used their gathered information to complete some amazing factual and eye-catching posters. In our math's lessons, LKS2 have been naming and stating the properties of 2D shapes, including triangles and a range of quadrilaterals. They were amazed at how many different shapes we have.
