Review and reflection on 2023-2024:

- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Key achievements to date	Areas for further development and baseline evidence of need
 LVSSCO membership continued and provided opportunities to engage in competitive and non-competitive sport. As part of mental well-being, each half term started with a well-being welcome back morning in which the staff and children engaged in well-being, PSHE and sports activities. External coaches have provided specific coaching for certain sports, cricket, tennis. School has had some sporting success, such as winning the gymnastics competition and coming joint 3rd in the rounders' tournament. Children make good use of the daily mile (Walk the World) providing fitness opportunities for all. Some sports equipment has been replaced and replenished ensuring high quality resources for the teaching and learning of PE and sports.
