Class One have had an incredibly busy week this week! In English, we have continued to use the book 'Here we are' by Oliver Jeffers as the foundation for our literacy learning. The children begun the week by asking some very big questions about planet Earth before creating some VERY impressive fact files about Earth! The children worked incredibly hard to plan, write and revise their work before producing the finished piece! In Maths, KS1 have been looking at comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to whilst our Reception children have been busy matching and organising groups!

This week, we also began our topic for this half term, beginning to look at the difference between past and present. The children all produced some lovely artwork of them as babies, as school children (presently) and what they imagined they will look like in the future.

In KS2 this week, the children have been gathering facts for their non-chronological Report on the Suffragettes. The children have looked at four influential women who during this period undertook some powerful protests, including throwing stones at the Prime Ministers Garden, graffitiing on the Houses of Parliament, refusing to eat and a Lady who changed her name and identity, as she was so adamant that all women should get a vote. By the end of next week, we should have some fantastic reports to show you.

In science we have been testing reflective surfaces in year 3 & 4 and in year 5 & 6 we have been investigating how light always travels in straight lines. They have all enjoyed using the torches and the coloured ones, to make everyone turn green and even purple!

We had Olivia joining us from 'Where the Wildings Are' who asked the children to spot signs of autumn and what fruit and vegetables were ready for harvesting. The children then completed some planting of bulbs in the grounds, which will hopefully look amazing in the spring.
